


Early Childhood Development February 2019

We received a visit from Hospice again. It is sometimes difficult for the parents to travel to the clinic. Therefore it is very fortunate for us when they visit our school.








The children are very fond of Jurie. During free play time all the children want to play with him and have his attention. He is a very good example to them all as a male role model.
